PROJECT OBJECTIVES

Establishment of an Alpine Soil Partnership:

Establishing a voluntary community that will jointly act towards better implementation of the Soil Conservation Protocol of the Alpine Convention • Bringing together Alpine soil experts, stakeholders, regional decision makers, international organisations, NGOs, and other users of soil information in order to create a long-lasting community committed to Alpine soil management and protection.

Strengthening Alpine Soil Management Information Sources:

Improving knowledge for sustainable soil management in the Alps • Identifying soil (and environmental) data and knowledge gaps • Testing data processing methods and elaborating transnational soil information on Alpine soils • Making Alpine soil data and derived information permanently accessible to end-users.

Formulation of Best Practices in Sustainable Soil and Ecosystem Service Management:

Maintaining living soil in forestry, spatial planning, agriculture, and water management • Testing best practices in case studies and successful solutions integrated into sectoral management plans on local and regional levels • Developing regional and local land management and soil protection plans.

Building Capacity and Transferring Knowledge www.AlpineSoils.eu:

Establishing the Alpine Soil Web Platform, thus providing end users and decision-makers a SharePoint for information on Alpine soils • Providing tools and training to enhance end-user skills for the integration of soil ecosystem services in daily environmental protection and land management practices • Disseminating knowledge and best practice examples to contribute to sustainable soil management capacities and decision-making in the Alps • Presenting datasets, tools, and a FAQ catalogue for soil management. • Providing consultancy services • Linking stakeholders and boosting cooperation by sharing the contact information of authorities and soil experts.
